The Company wishes to thank Air North and its management for their very valuable assistance during the successful Pilot Project. Although the target aircraft was in dedicated charter service, and thus provided a relatively limited number of flight hours per month for analysis and customization purposes, suggestions, comments and guidance from Air North throughout the Project were most helpful.
