1. Corporate Information

Triangle Industries Ltd. (the "Company") was incorporated on November 16, 1983 under the British Columbia Companies Act and was in the business of providing freight and reloading services. The Company wound up its transloading business and disposed of substantially all related assets in the year ended December 31, 2010. Management is of the opinion that Company resources could be better utilized under a new business plan designed to improve the Company's prospects and to recapture shareholder interest.

The Company is listed on the NEX and trades under the symbol TIA.H. The Company's address is 800-570 Granville Street, Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada. The Company's registered office is located at 400-570 Granville Street, Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada.

These condensed consolidated interim financial statements were approved and authorized for issue by the Board of Directors on November 26, 2013.

The Company's ability to continue as a going concern depends on its ability to raise adequate financing and to develop profitable operations. Management expects that the Company has sufficient resources and will be able to secure the necessary financing to meet the Company's requirements on an ongoing basis. The condensed consolidated interim financial statements do not include adjustments to amounts and classifications of assets and liabilities that might be necessary should the Company be unable to continue operations.

The Company incurred a net loss of \$30,165 during the nine months ended September 30, 2013 (2012 - \$34,518), and as of that date the Company's accumulated deficit was \$6,776,766 (2012 - \$6,746,601).

2. Basis of Presentation and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

a) Basis of Presentation and Measurement

These unaudited condensed consolidated interim financial statements for the nine months ended September 30, 2013 have been prepared in accordance with IAS 34 Interim Financial Reporting. They do not include all disclosures that would otherwise be required in a complete set of financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the Company's 2012 annual financial statements which have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS") as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ("IASB").

The condensed consolidated interim financial statements have been prepared using accounting policies consistent with those used in the Company's 2012 annual financial statements except for new standards, interpretation and amendments mandatorily effective for the first time from January 1, 2013. Note 2c sets out the impact of new standards, interpretations and amendments that have had a material effect on the financial statements.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with IFRS requires management to make certain critical accounting estimates and exercise judgement in applying the Company's policies. The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements are disclosed in Note 3.

b) Principles of consolidation

The unaudited condensed consolidated interim financial statements include the financial statements of the parent company, Triangle Industries Ltd., and its subsidiaries listed below:

The financial statements of the subsidiaries are included in the consolidated financial statements from the date that control commences until the date that control ceases. All intercompany balances and transactions have been eliminated.

c) New Accounting Pronouncements

The following new or amended standards and interpretations that are mandatory for 2013 annual periods have been adopted and none of these standards has had a material impact on the Company's interim financial position and results of operations upon adoption:

- IFRS 7, Financial Instruments: Disclosures amendments require additional disclosures on transferred financial assets.
- IFRS 10, *Consolidated Financial Statements* establishes principles for the presentation and preparation of consolidated financial statements when an entity controls one or more other entities.
- IFRS 12, *Disclosure of Interests in Other Entities* establishes disclosure requirements for subsidiaries, joint arrangements, associates and unconsolidated structured entities.
- IFRS 13, Fair Value Measurement defines fair value and sets out a single IFRS framework for measuring fair value and disclosures about fair value measurements.

d) Accounting Pronouncements Not Yet Effective

The Company has reviewed new and revised accounting pronouncements that have been issued but are not yet effective. The Company has not early adopted any of these standards and is currently evaluating the impact, if any, that these standards might have on its consolidated financial statements.

• IAS 32 (Amendment), *Financial Instruments* amendment to clarify requirements for offsetting financial assets and financial liabilities.

• IFRS 9, *Financial Instruments* replaces the current standard IAS 39 *Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement,* replacing the current classification and measurement criteria for financial assets and liabilities with only two classification categories: amortized cost and fair value.

3. Critical Accounting Estimates

The preparation of consolidated financial statements in conformance with IFRS requires management to make estimates, judgments and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

There have been no material revisions to the nature of judgments and amount of changes in estimates in this period from amounts reported in the Company's 2012 annual financial statements.

5. Share Capital

The Company is authorized to issue an unlimited number of common shares without par value. There were no shares issued from December 31, 2011 to September 30, 2013.

6. Share-Based Payments

Stock Option Plan Details

The Company, in accordance with its 2008 Stock Option Plan ("the 2008 Plan"), is authorized to grant options to directors, officers, employees, consultants, or service providers of the Company. Under the 2008 Plan, the maximum number of common shares which may be eligible for issuance at any one time, including shares issuable upon exercise of options outstanding is 2,731,391 common shares. Furthermore, the maximum number of common shares which may be granted to a participant under the 2008 Plan shall not exceed 5% of its issued and outstanding common shares on a non-diluted basis.

The terms of the 2008 Plan provide that the Board of Directors have the right to grant options to acquire common shares of the Company at not less than the closing market price of the shares at the time of granting the option. The options can be granted for a maximum term of 5 years. Options granted under the terms of the 2008 Plan vest at the discretion of the Board of Directors. On September 7, 2012, the Corporation's listing was moved to the NEX board of the TSX Venture Exchange and is therefore limited to grant stock options up to 10% of its issued and outstanding in and 12 month period.
