Introduction

This Management Discussion and Analysis Report has been prepared to provide material updates and analysis of the business operations, financial condition, financial performance, cash flows, liquidity, and capital resources of Mineworx Technologies Ltd. (formally Iberian Minerals Ltd.) and its subsidiaries ("Mineworx" or the "Company").

The information provided herein should be read in conjunction with the Company's unaudited condensed audited consolidated financial statements and the notes thereto for the three months ended September 30, 2018, and the Annual MD&A for the year ending December 31, 2017.

The statements have been prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS").

Mineworx is listed on the TSX Venture Exchange under the symbol "MWX", on the OTCQB Exchange under the symbol "MWXRF" and on the Frankfurt Stock Exchange under the symbol "YRS". The Company is engaged in the development and deployment of innovative mining technologies and the exploration, acquisition and development of mineral properties.

Except as otherwise disclosed, all dollar figures in this report are stated in Canadian dollars. The effective date of this report is November 27, 2018.

Corporate Overview

In June 2017, the Company officially changed its name to Mineworx Technologies Ltd. to better reflect the changed business focus. In late 2015, the Company implemented a strategy to pursue and investigate a new paradigm being created in the mining sector to complement its Spanish mineral assets and current business model.

In December 2015, the Company acquired Mineworx Technologies Inc., who developed the HM X-tract, a unique, patent-pending, portable, heavy mineral extraction process and an innovative new business model for the gold and precious metals mining sector. As of June 30, 2017, Mineworx Technologies Inc. and Mineworx Technologies Ltd. (the former Iberian Minerals Ltd) were amalgamated into one company that continued under the Mineworx Technologies Ltd. name.

The Mineworx business model is to seek out advanced-stage mineral deposits on which to employ its portable processing technologies, and to partner with the existing owners and operators to advance these deposits to profitable production in a timely and cost-efficient manner. The model offers operators accelerated production timelines, lower cut off grades, reduced infrastructure, shorter permitting periods, improved market valuations, and lower the operating costs, environmental impact and the economic risks.

The unique, integrated water clarification and filtration technologies allows operators to recycle most of the process water used at a typical mine site. This conserves water, minimizes environmental discharge and significantly reduces or eliminates the necessity for tailings ponds.

As part of the strategic review the Company decided to spin out the HM X-leach technology to the newly formed public entity Enviroleach Technologies Inc. in the first quarter of 2017. This transaction allowed the shareholders of Mineworx to continue to share in the promising upside of the technology while the Company focused on the development of the Mineworx business model.

On March 15, 2017, the Company received a final order from the Alberta Court of Queen's Bench on the plan of arrangement involving Iberian, shareholders of Iberian and Enviroleach Technologies Inc. The plan of arrangement involves the spin-out of the technology rights to EnviroLeach Technologies Inc. and the distribution to Company shareholders of 26,000,000

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common shares of Enviroleach Technologies Inc. The plan of arrangement was approved by shareholders at the Company's Special Meeting held on March 14, 2017.

Under the terms of the Arrangement Agreement, through a statutory plan of arrangement under the Business Corporations Act (Alberta) (the "Arrangement"), The Company transferred the Technology to Enviroleach in exchange for total compensation of \$8,600,000 comprised of:

- i) 28 million common shares of Enviroleach,
- promissory notes in the amount of \$1,600,000 made by Enviroleach in favour of the Company. \$600,000 is due by September 2017 and the remaining \$1,000,000 is due in two years and carries a 5% interest rate.
- iii) The Company will retain a license agreement in perpetuity for the Enviroleach, patent-pending, non-cyanide gold leaching solution.

The Arrangement was completed on March 21, 2017 and the company distributed 25,999,813 Enviroleach shares to the company shareholders of record on March 21, 2017 as a return of capital dividend with a deemed price of \$0.25 per Enviroleach share.

After working in conjunction with Enviroleach it was realized that utilizing Mineworx technology and expertise enhanced recoveries of precious metals in E-Waste material during the Enviroleach process. With this knowledge Enviroleach and Mineworx agreed to create a Joint Venture to pursue opportunities in the E-Waste sector. On September 1, 2017 Enviroleach announced an agreement with Jabil Inc. for E-Waste processing. The contract work associated with this agreement will be fulfilled by the Mineworx/Enviroleach Joint Venture. The Mineworx equity share of the joint venture is 20%.

During 2017 the customer focus of Mineworx changed from the mining industry to the E-waste sector. This was the result of opportunities that arose while working in conjunction with Enviroleach. The management of Mineworx believes that this new sector offers an accelerated route to profitability.

After the successful implementation of the E-waste strategy the company will resume pursuing opportunities in the mining industry.

Overall Performance

In the nine months ending September 30, 2018 the activities of the Mineworx team were devoted to the development of the E-waste business strategy. Mineworx personnel have been working in conjunction with the staff of Enviroleach and Jabil to complete the installation and commissioning of the first production plant.

During commissioning the need for modifications of the dry processing were required. To prove the modifications would cure the issues created form varied feedstocks the joint venture commenced construction on a dry concentrate plant in a facility in Vancouver.

All necessary documentation to increase the size of the Cehegin iron ore concession has been submitted. The work necessary to submit for a work/drill program permitting was completed. As part of this process the Company was required to post additional security of \$209,048.

Management of the company has spent time discussing the revised Mineworx business model to various institutional investing groups to increase the demand in the marketplace for the company shares.

Fluctuations in the Company's expenditures reflect the variations in the timing of exploration and development activities, general corporate operations, the timing of share-based payments, and write-down or sale of certain exploration, evaluation, or other assets.

Financial results

The Company had no operating revenue for the nine months ended September 30, 2018 and 2017. For the nine months ended September 30, 2018, the Company incurred a net loss of \$2,685,227 compared to net income of \$6,809,875 for the nine months ended September 30, 2017. The net loss was a result of spending on corporate general and administration compared to a gain on the sale of the HM X-leach technology to Enviroleach Technologies Inc in 2017.

Total expenses of \$1,570,514 related general administration and sales in the nine months ended September 30, 2018 (2017 - \$1,065,750).

Consulting fees were \$86,861 (2017 - \$93,848), the increase relates the activities undertaken by management to provide the marketplace exposure to the new business strategy that the company is pursuing. This is also why investor relations of \$219,274 (2017 - \$120,170) and travel of \$83,133 (2017 - \$47,830) were increased.

Management and employee costs were \$354,169 (2017 - \$522,908), the decrease resulted from reduced management costs and that some of the costs of Mineworx shop employees were recovered from the E-waste joint venture.

Professional fees were \$40,416 (2017 - \$65,367), the decrease resulted from a reduction in the requirement for legal services.

Project costs were \$9,803 (2017 - \$64,300), the reduction resulted the majority of the company activities occurring in the E-waste joint venture.

Share based costs were 627,852 (2017 – 10) that relate to 300,000 options granted at a price of 0.26, 3,450,000 options granted at a price of 0.175, and the vesting of options granted in 2017.

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The \$259,519 loss on securities held for sale (2017 – gain of \$780,000) is a result of the remaining 961,182 Enviroleach Technologies shares the company held reducing in value. The market value of the shares at September 30, 2018 was \$1.01 per share.

The Company recognized a gain of \$2,059 (2017 – gain \$15,128) on foreign currency related primarily to the Euro.

\$532,213 in amortization was charged in the nine months ended September 30, 2018 (2017 - \$542,578) related to the equipment and technology acquired in the Mineworx transaction. The asset base the amortization is calculated on was slightly smaller in 2018 than in 2017.

The company recognized a loss of \$387,981 (2017 - \$nil) related to its 20% minority interest in the E-waste joint venture. The joint venture had total losses of \$1,939,905 in the nine months ended September 30, 2018.

Quarterly Financial Information

In the quarter ending September 30, 2018, the company incurred a loss of \$1,162,098 (2017 - \$745,577), There was no revenue from operations in the quarter.

Total expenses for general administration in the three months ending September 30, 2018 was \$875,448 (2017 - \$247,106). The variance in G&A when compared to 2017 is primarily share-based payments of \$540,072 (2017 - \$nil) from the granting of 3,450,000 options in the quarter. In 2017 options were granted in Q4. The remaining variance is related to management and employee costs of \$114,403 (2017 - \$88,508) increasing due to increases in compensation rates to employees compared to 2017.

In 2017 a gain on the Enviroleach securities held of \$20,000 compared to a loss of \$28,835 in the three months ending September 30, 2018.

The company recognized a loss of \$87,516 (2017 - \$nil) related to its 20% minority interest in the E-waste joint venture. The joint venture had total losses of \$437,580 in the three months ended September 30, 2018.

Exploration and Evaluation Assets

For the nine months ended September 30, 2018, the Cehegin total expenditures were \$16,418 (2017 - \$50,830), comprised of geological expenses of \$4,913, mining rights and taxes of \$3316, and field costs of \$8,189. Cehegin was the only property development advanced in 2018 and the reduced spending is a result of waiting for government approval to start the next phase of development drilling.

Equipment

For the nine months ended September 30, 2018, the expenditures on equipment were \$22,728 (2017 - \$25,144). The 2018 expenditures are \$10,849 for office equipment and \$11,879 for tooling compared to 2017 which was for tooling used in the fabrication shop.

Intangible Assets

There was \$9,113 spending for the patent that was issued by the US Patent Office for the Mobile Mining System in Q3 on intangible assets in 2018. The 2018 balance of \$1,830,838 is reduced from the 2017 carrying value by the amortization charged. Amortization of the patents commenced and is being recognized over a 17 year life.

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Liquidity and Capital Resources

At September 30, 2018, the Company's cash position was \$1,490,758 (September 30, 2017 - \$164,283) and the working capital was \$3,239,943 as compared to working capital of \$1.833,589 at September 30, 2017. The working capital increased due to the cash contributions from the warrant and options exercised in the first quarter. The Company still holds 961,182 Enviroleach shares that it plans to hold until the Company's cash requirements determine selling the shares would be the best option or the market conditions dictate that it is to the Company's advantage to sell the shares.

Net cash used in operating activities for the three months ended September 30, 2018 was \$1,122,334 (2017 - \$1,259,863), which relates primarily to general and administrative expenses offset by the decrease in payables due from Enviroleach.

Net cash used in investing activities for the nine months ended September 30, 2018 was \$893,734 (2017 – \$303,189). \$846,122 was required as an equity contribution to fund the working capital of the joint venture with Enviroleach offset by a reduction to the requirement to fund restricted cash related to the Spanish assets.

Net cash provided by financing activities for the nine months ended September 30, 2018 was \$2,923,430 (2017 – \$688,068). The exercising of warrants \$1,995,500 (2017 - \$295,000) and options \$379,000 (2017 - \$151,000), and received repayment of Notes Payable of \$548,930 (2017- \$242,068).

The Company is in an exploration and development phase and is not generating revenue as of yet, it is expected that the working capital balance will follow a cycle of reduction and replenishment. Management currently follows a policy of raising only sufficient capital to carry out its near-term plans. This policy is meant to minimize dilution of shareholders' positions by raising capital when the stock price is at higher levels.

Capital Commitments

The Company had no commitments for property and equipment expenditures for fiscal 2018. The Company expects that any property and equipment expenditures incurred, based on future needs, will be funded from working capital and/or from operating or capital leases.
