Australis Capital Inc. (“**Australis**”) has disposed (the “**Dispositions**”) of 2,618,574 common shares (the “**Common Shares**”) of the Issuer.

All references herein to “\$” refer to Canadian dollars unless otherwise indicated.

1.2 State the name of the market in which the transaction or other occurrence that triggered the requirement to file this report took place.

On June 18, 2020, Australis disposed of 1,802,542 Common Shares pursuant to a License, Development and Service Agreement (the “**Passport Agreement**”) dated October 29, 2019 between Australis and Passport Technology Canada Ltd. (“**PTC**”) as amended.

Australis has also reported the disposition of 816,032 Common Shares in aggregate through sales conducted through the facilities of the Canadian Securities Exchange since the date of the last early warning report by Australis (sales completed between April 6, 2020 and June 12, 2020) (the “**Transactions**”).

2.2 State the date of the transaction or other occurrence that triggered the requirement to file this report and briefly describe the transaction or other occurrence.

PTC’s parent company, Passport Technology Inc. (“**Passport Technology**”), is a leading developer of technology-based products and services for the highly regulated payments, gaming and financial services markets. Passport Technology's products include attended payment kiosks, cash access systems, server and web-based analytic technology, agnostic application management systems, and interactive content and services.

Pursuant to the Passport Agreement, PTC has agreed to adapt Passport Technology's self-service platform to service the cannabis industry, undertake prototype development and ongoing product enhancements, and has granted to Australis exclusive software rights and exclusive use of vendor relationships at cost (the "Services"). The Passport Agreement contemplates an exclusive 10-year relationship between the parties. On November 29, 2019, Australis transferred to PTC 5,000,000 Common Shares as part of the consideration payable to PTC under the Passport Agreement.

Pursuant to the Passport Agreement, on June 18, 2020, Australis transferred 1,802,542 Common Shares in aggregate.

In addition, pursuant to the Transactions conducted through the facilities of the Canadian Securities Exchange between April 6, 2020 and June 12, 2020 Australis disposed of 816,032 Common Shares in aggregate.

Item 3 – Interest in Securities of the Reporting Issuer

3.1 State the designation and number or principal amount of securities acquired or disposed of that triggered the requirement to file this report and the change in the Acquiror's securityholding percentage in the class of securities.

Australis disposed of 1,802,542 Common Shares pursuant to the Passport Agreement and 816,032 Common Shares pursuant to the Transactions.

Prior to the Dispositions, Australis held 18,996,128 Common Shares and unsecured convertible debentures (the "Debentures") of the Issuer in the principal amount of \$1,600,000 convertible into 2,909,091 Common Shares at a price of \$0.55 per Common Share. Assuming conversion of all Debentures, Australis held approximately 20.4% of the issued and outstanding Common Shares on a partially diluted basis and approximately 18.2% of the issued and outstanding Common Shares on an undiluted basis.

After the Dispositions, Australis holds 16,377,554 Common Shares and the Debentures in the principal amount of \$1,600,000. Assuming conversion of all Debentures, Australis holds approximately 18.0% of the issued and outstanding Common Shares on a partially diluted basis and approximately 15.7% of the issued and outstanding Common Shares on an undiluted basis.

Pursuant to a conversion agreement dated July 1, 2019 (the "Conversion Agreement"), Australis agreed to convert the Debentures into 2,909,091 Common Shares on July 1, 2020.

Item 4 – Consideration Paid

1,802,542 Common Shares described in Item 1.1 were transferred by Australis in consideration for the Services at a deemed price of \$0.47 per Common Share for total consideration of \$855,423.

816,032 Common Shares described in Item 1.1 were sold by Australis pursuant to the Transactions for aggregate consideration of \$346,813.60 at an average price of \$0.425 per Common Share.

Pursuant to the Conversion Agreement Australis agreed to convert the Debentures into 2,909,091 Common Shares on July 1, 2020.

Pursuant to an investment agreement dated October 30, 2018, between Australis and the Issuer (the “**Investment Agreement**”), for as long as Australis owns 10% of the issued and outstanding Common Shares, Australis will be entitled to nominate one (1) director to the board of directors of the Issuer (the “**Board**”). If Australis exercises all of its warrants of the Issuer and converts all of its debentures of the Issuer, Australis will be entitled to nominate a second director to the Board. For as long as Australis maintains at least 25% of the issued and outstanding Common Shares of the Issuer, Australis will be entitled to maintain two (2) directors on the Board.

Australis acquired the Common Shares and Debentures for investment purposes. In pursuing such purposes, Australis takes a long-term view of its investment. It reserves the right to formulate other plans or make other proposals, and take such actions with respect to its investment in the Issuer. Depending on market conditions and other factors, Australis may acquire additional securities of the Issuer as Australis may deem appropriate, whether in open market purchases, privately negotiated transactions or otherwise. Australis continues to evaluate numerous potential transactions and in connection therewith may exchange Common Shares for other assets or may sell Common Shares to increase its cash position. Australis may also reconsider and change its plans or proposals relating to the foregoing.

Item 6 – Agreements, Arrangements, Commitments or Understandings With Respect to Securities of the Reporting Issuer

Pursuant to the terms of the Investment Agreement, Australis will have the right to participate in any future equity offerings of the Issuer to maintain an ownership interest in the Issuer equal to the percentage ownership prior to such an offering, provided that such ownership interest does not exceed 40%. Such participation right will expire at the time that Australis no longer holds 10% or more of the issued and outstanding common shares of the Issuer.

There are no changes in any material facts from Australis’ early warning reports dated May 26, 2020, November 28, 2019, July 2, 2019, May 9, 2019, February 7, 2019, December 5, 2018 and November 5, 2018 except as described herein.
