As part of the Debt Settlement, Suresh Singh, President of the Corporation, was issued 1,100,000 Shares, Bryan Loree, the CFO of the Corporation, was issued 1,100,000 Shares, Rav Mlait, CEO of the Corporation, was issued 1,100,000 Shares, (collectively, the “Related Parties”) in the Debt Settlement is considered a “related party transaction” under Multilateral Instrument 61-101 Protection of Minority Security Holders in Special Transactions (“MI 61- 101”). The Corporation is relying on Sections 5.5(a) and 5.7(1)(a) of MI 61-101, respectively, for exemptions from the formal valuation and minority approval requirements under MI 61-101, as neither the fair market value of the Shares issued to the Related Parties nor the amount of debt settled pursuant thereto exceeded 25% of the Corporation’s market capitalization. All Shares issued pursuant to the Debt Settlement will be subject to a hold period of four months and one day from their date of issuance.
