MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION & ANALYSIS
For the Six Months Ended January 31, 2020 and 2019

This Management Discussion and Analysis ("MD&A") of Express Capital Corp. ("Express" or the "Company") has been prepared by management as of March 30, 2020 and should be read together with the unaudited condensed interim financial statements and related notes for the period ended January 31, 2020 which are prepared in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS"). Additional information regarding the Company can be found on SEDAR at www.sedar.com. All of the following amounts are expressed in Canadian dollars unless otherwise stated. The reader should also refer to the annual audited financial statements for the period ended July 31, 2019.

Overall Performance

Express Capital Corp. (the "Company") was incorporated as a wholly-owned subsidiary of reporting issuer Pharmalogix Investments Corp. (Formerly <u>UWO Consulting Ltd.) ("UWO")</u> on November 11, 2014 under the laws of British Columbia, Canada. Pursuant to a plan of arrangement between the Company and UWO, the Company's shares were distributed to the shareholders of UWO during the year ended July 31, 2018. The Company is in the business of consulting on capital markets deal structuring, venture capital and corporate advisory. Its head office and registered office is located at #1740-1177 West Hastings Street, Vancouver, BC, V6E 2K3, Canada.

Results of Operations

During the three months ended January 31, 2020, the Company incurred a net loss of \$9,385 (2019: \$24,502) consisting of legal and accounting expenses of \$4,463 (2019: \$5,247), transfer agent and filing fees expenses of \$1,809 (2019: \$Nil), consulting fees of \$2,625 (2019: \$Nil) and general and administrative expenses of \$488 (2019: \$19,255).

During the six months ended January 31, 2020, the Company incurred a net loss of \$14,052 (2019: \$33,192) consisting of legal and accounting expenses of \$6,755 (2019: \$6,609), transfer agent and filing fees expenses of \$2,898 (2019: \$Nil), consulting fees of \$2,625 (2019: \$Nil) and general and administrative expenses of \$1,774 (2019: \$26,583).

Liquidity and Capital Resources

At January 31, 2020, the Company reported a working capital deficit of \$22,716 (July 31, 2019: \$8,664) and cash of \$610 (July 31, 2019: \$6,172).

At January 31, 2020, the Company had accounts payable of \$20,517 (July 31, 2019: \$14,836).

On April 10, 2018, the Company issued 4,000,000 common shares for proceeds of \$120,000.

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The Company may continue to have capital requirements in excess of its currently available resources. In the event the Company's plans change, its assumptions change or prove inaccurate, or its capital resources in addition to projected cash flow, if any, prove to be insufficient to fund operations, the Company may be required to seek additional financing. There can be no assurance that the Company will have sufficient financing to meet its future capital requirements or that additional financing will be available on terms acceptable to the Company in the future.

Recent Accounting Policies Not Yet Adopted

IFRS 16, Leases (effective January 1, 2019) introduced new requirements for the classification and measurement of leases. Under IFRS 16, a lessee no longer classifies leases as operating or financing and records all leases on the condensed consolidated statement of financial position, unless the lease term is 12 months or less or the underlying asset has a low value. The Company has applied a modified retrospective transition approach. The Company does not have any leases, and as a result, this standard had no impact on the Company's financial statements on adoption.

IFRIC 23, Uncertainty over Income Tax Treatments (effective January 1, 2019) provides guidance when there is uncertainty over income tax treatments including, but not limited to, whether uncertain tax treatments should be considered separately; assumptions made about the examination of tax treatments by tax authorities; the determination of taxable profit, tax bases, unused tax losses, unused tax credits, and tax rates; and, the impact of changes in facts and circumstances. This interpretation did not have an impact on the Company's financial statements.

The Company has not early adopted this revised standard and is currently assessing the impact that this standard will have on its financial statements.

Other accounting standards or amendments to existing accounting standards that have been issued but have future effective dates are either not applicable or are not expected to have a significant impact on the Company's financial statements.
